

Creating a Holy Space: Sing or meditate upon the hymn "Holy Ground"

Receiving the Light (please light a candle as a reminder that you are surrounded by the light and love of Christ)

Time of Silent Meditation (holding prayer rock)

Prayer: Loving God, we come before you now from living rooms, and seats at kitchen tables, and perhaps our porches or backyards, either as individuals or as families, to offer up our praise and our concerns. In doing so we stand on the promises from scripture that you are with us, that you are our rock, our fortress, our deliverer. It is you in whom we take our refuge during this anxious and uncertain time as countries around the world struggle to keep a viral pandemic from overpowering us. We know that the greatest way that it does that is through unleashing such fear within our hearts that we become paralyzed, make bad decisions, and lose hope. We pray for your peace that passes all understanding so that we might think clearly and act wisely and with compassion. We recognize that you call us at this time to be each other's keepers but that this is made difficult when we must keep social distance from each other. Even so we pray that you would stir our hearts and minds with ways that we can help each other through phone calls, or dropping off meals at doorsteps, and offering help in ways that would not compromise anyone's health or safety. Help us, God, to function as your Body on earth.

No matter how difficult this time may seem, we are surrounded at every moment by countless blessings, including each new breath we take as the season of spring begins its wondrous entry into the part of the world we live in. We pause now to thank you for the following blessings in our lives:

LIST JOYS

And, standing on the promise from scripture that when two or three are gathered together in your name with hearts united and of one accord you are present in a special way, so we lift up to you all those concerns we have been emailed, and all the people and situations about which we are concerned, knowing that you will answer our prayers according to your will and your timetable.

LIST CONCERNS

Loving, merciful, and just God, we now lift up to you now all the leaders on earth, and especially our own government, national, state, and local. We ask that you fill all leaders with your Spirit so that they might make wise and compassionate decisions, informed not by greed but by concern about the common good of our global community.

We lift up to you all of our essential workers and especially our health care providers, who may be working in dangerous situations. Keep them safe and in your loving care.

We pray for all those who presently are without work and those who are working but whose children are out of school or day care.

We pray for all who have been afflicted with COVID-19 asking that they might receive the best of health care. We pray for their loved ones. We pray for our health system. We pray that effective treatment and a vaccine might soon be found.

We pray for all those who are now quarantined at home, sometimes alone. We pray for all those who now have been ordered not to leave their homes except to get essential services and may be feeling anxious and lonely.

We especially pray that during this time we might become a more compassionate world as we realize all the more clearly how very interconnected we are as we remember again our calling to be good stewards of your universe.

We thank you for your son Jesus the Christ, who walked on earth, including during times of great hardship and who, when asked how we should pray, answered his disciples then and now that you should pray by using these words:

"Our Father who art in heaven, hallowed be Thy name. Thy kingdom come, Thy will be done – on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread, and forgive us our sins as we forgive those who sin against us. Lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil for Thine is the kingdom, the power, and the glory forever. Amen."

Communion Prayer

With grateful hearts, O God, we remember the gift of your love in Jesus Christ, who for our sakes was broken that we may be made whole. Bind us together in Christian love. Grant that Christ may be made known to us afresh in the breaking of this bread and the drinking of this cup. Amen.

(Please set out your communion elements to take as you recite the words of institution)

The Lord Jesus, on the night he was betrayed, took a loaf of bread (lift bread), and when he had given thanks, he broke it and said, "This is my body that is for you. Do this in remembrance of me." In the same way he took the cup also (lift up cup), after supper, saying, "This cup is the new covenant in my blood. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me." For as often as you eat this bread and drink this cup, you proclaim the Lord's death until he comes. These are the gifts of God, for you the people of God. Let us partake together (think about all your brothers and sisters in Christ who also are taking communion this morning as you remember Jesus).
